RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED that the Town of Covington accepts the dedication of a cemetery by Sigmund Katz and Jessie Weil Katz, by act before Gordon Goodbee, Notary Public, dated May 7, 1948, and recorded in the conveyance records of St. Tammany Parish, Louisiana, book 183, folio 94, in accordance with the terms of said dedication, and which cemetery is described as follows, to-wit:

In Section Forty-four (44), Township Seven (7) South, Range Eleven (11) East, Greensburg District Louisiana, and being within the Town of Covington, Louisiana, and more fully described as follows:

Commencing at the intersection of America and Lafayette Streets and running South 57 degrees East along the South side of Lafayette Street a distance of 502 feet, thence run South 22 degrees 50 minutes West 245 feet to an iron stake set for the point of beginning and designated as (A) on the attached map.

From the above point of beginning run South 47 degrees 20 minutes West 40 feet to an iron stake, thence South 42 degrees 40 minutes East 40 feet to an iron stake, thence North 47 degrees 20 minutes East 40 feet to an iron stake, thence North 42 degrees 40 minutes West, a distance of 40 feet to the point of beginning.

All as per map and proces verbal of survey made by C. R. Schultz, Surveyor, dated April 2, 1948, copy of which is attached hereto, and being a portion of the property acquired by Sigmund J. Katz by purchase from Marie J. Keller, et al on the 15th day of December, 1932, by act before J. Monroe Simmons, St. Tammany Parish Notary Public, and filed for record in Conveyance Book 121, folio 166 of the official records of St. Tammany Parish.

Motion for the adoption of the above resolution was made by Louis Voss, seconded by Kenneth Julian, and on roll call the resolution was unanimously adopted.

There being no further business to transact, it was moved by Hubie Gallagher, seconded by Leo LeBlanc, and unanimously carried that the meeting be adjourned.
