A regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Covington, Louisiana was held at 7:30 P. M. on Tuesday, April 8, 1952, at City Hall.

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Emile L. Menetre, and on roll call the following Councilmen were present:

It was moved by Giles Pennington, seconded by Kenneth Julian, and unanimously carried that the minutes of the last meeting be accepted as published.

After reviewing the Secretary-Treasurer's report, it was moved by Louis Voss, seconded by Leo LeBlanc, and unanimously carried that the report be referred to the finance committee.


Mrs. Anna Smith, Mrs. Alma Schultz and Mrs. Leo LeBlanc, representing the Womens Progressive Union, appeared before the Council with a request for the Town to assist them in improving the Covington Cemetery. The Mayor, with the unanimous approval of the Council, advised Mrs. Smith that the Town would be glad to send in a crew to clean the ditches and haul away the trash as it had on many previous occasions.

Mrs. A. R. Smith, Jr., representing the Sportman's Club, appeared before the Council with a request that some effort be made by the Town to open a street leading to the river. After a brief discussion as to the various streets that could be opened, Mayor Menetre appointed a committee composed of Councilmen Julian and LeBlanc and Voss to study the matter and made recommendations to the Council.

It was moved by Louis Voss, seconded by Kenneth Julian, and unanimously carried that Economy Motors, having submitted the lowest bid in the amount of \$1343.76, for furnishing a new police car for the Town of Covington, be awarded the bid.

It was moved by Leo LeBlanc, seconded by Giles Pennington, and unanimously carried that the meeting be adjourned and all further business be tabled until the next meeting to be held on Monday, April 14, 1952.
